OUTCOME	HOW IT CAN BE ACHIEVED
1. More jobs:	because there is less employment regulation and the workplace relations system encourages businesses and staff to make agreements that meet their mutual interests.
2. Prosperous businesses:	because employment costs are tailored to business conditions and employee needs.
3. Higher incomes:	because wages are linked to improved productivity and performance.
4. Increased living standards:	because incomes are rising, there is a balance between work and family and jobs are more secure.
5. New jobs for youth:	because employers have renewed confidence to employ staff.
6. Lower unemployment:	because there are new jobs and improved incentives to enter the labour market and work productively.
7. More career choices:	because there is an abundance of different jobs, working arrangements and training in a diverse and growing economy.

9. Balance in work and family:	because employers and employees in individual workplaces make decisions that suit their needs and circumstances.
